Description			
The problem			
<p>NetBSD was once a leader in open source operating systems. It was the first free OS to have USB support, IPv6 support, and set a transfer speed record two years in a row. However, over time, it's suffered from not marketing its strengths actively. Thus, it's not maintained a heavy influx of developers, even though due to many technical advantages such as a machine-independent architecture which make it an ideal platform for hacking device drivers. The lack of a large stream of revenue (donations) make it difficult to commission consultant work to complete features which are critical to its mainstream acceptance. I believe the project is coming to a breaking point, and if something isn't done to turn it around, we might be passing a point of no return.</p>			
Hypothesis			
<p>If the project were to have a solid marketing campaign, we could attract more developers and receive more donations. More developers can keep the current ecosystem running while adding features to make the product valuable. More donations can continue to fund the project and the commissioning of consultant work without putting its "endowment" in danger. The first step of attracting more developers and donations is to have a website which sells them the product.</p>			
<p>We need to know what are the goals. What are the calls to action? What do we want people to do? In order of importance:</p>			
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Download - Use the OS;2. Develop - Get involved;3. Donate - Fund the project;4. Documentation - RTFM, FAQ, Guides, etc;5. News - Security, updates, news, events, etc;6. Search - everything else;			
<p>Who is the target demographic? Some groups are:</p>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Minimalists - OS hipsters. People who want a fast, lean, secure, easy-to-manage OS;- Researchers - super nerds who want to hack the system to do whatever they want;- Hobbyists - mega nerds who make the system run on specialised devices like the Raspberry Pi and the Arduino;- NetApp vendors - NetBSD powers many home broadband routers supplied by ISPs. It can run on NAS servers and routers;- Admins - people who run large scale infrastructures (see: us, Joyent, etc);			
<p>The site has to sell the OS to people. Why would people use it?</p>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Secure;- Lightweight;- Easy to port to other architectures/hardware platforms/targets;- Good hardware support;- Free (license);- Fast;- Developed actively;- International community;			
Procedure			
<p>We're going for a complete rebranding of NetBSD. We're not married to a particular layout, colour scheme, nor logo. This task has a hard budget of eighty (80) hours. The board wants to see the mockups piecemeal and provide feedback as we go. Let's start with two redesigns of the main page of the website. Next, board wants to see two mockups of any of these pages which get the most traffic:</p>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- http://www.netbsd.org/support/security/ (this would be better combined with the News section into a section named thus);- http://www.netbsd.org/docs/- http://www.netbsd.org/releases/ (can be combined with- http://www.netbsd.org/mirrors/ as "Download" and split into "Develop");			

We can rearrange the content on the site and subsections as we wish. Finally, the mockups they choose will be cut into markup. I believe that we will have time to provide them with 3-4 complete rebrands, plus designs of two or more of the above sections. I have some ideas for logos, but will reserve describing them here as to not taint your creative process.

The checklist seems to be about 40 hours of work. Although each page is listed as having two designs, those designs could vary from page to page, as to produce a different set of mockups for each section (if we want). ETA'd based on past estimates on similar tasks, which have proven consistent.

Is there any danger that the feather will create confusion in people's minds that we are part of Apache? In any case, I don't think that "lightweight" is the term we want to convey. Clean, efficient, etc. but lightweight suggests that we are not suitable for doing the heavy lifting. The term that I like is "workhorse". That's one of the ways that I differentiate us from Linux.

I don't like this one very much. The perception of being a BSD for vintage computers has got NetBSD anywhere.

A response to that was:

I agree, here are some more (hopefully constructive) comments: - I think that there should be some continuity in the logo, i.e. switching from

the flag to a feather is not ideal. And I think that the feather idea is flawed, since we are not really lightweight.

- I think that we can do better with the flags. It seems to me that the straight transformation of the flag concept to the "flat" vision can be improved. For example, the flag does not have to be solid. It does not need to have a shadow. Play with the flag concept some more.*
- I like the new font, but not so much the trailing capital D, since it has the weight upwards.*

A response to that was:

I'm a big fan of the new flag version, FWIW. (the broken-up one)

From someone else regarding both:

I still like the current logo most. To me, these proposals are not a win. YMMV.

Finally, from one of the more active members:

Anyway.. Let's make sure we don't get so distracted by the logo that we forget about the web design.

We're going to have to do better with the last two logo proposals and mockups. I've let them know that the ETA for this task has been extended and it won't be developed during the next ten days due to higher priority tasks. Don't let the comments get you down. - Not sure if a new logo should be the first thing to change, but.. I am neutral here; if that drives NetBSD's web revamp, then it is a good thing.
- If the decision is to revamp not only the design, but also change our logo, then I would also suggest to go all the way down and also change the colour scheme. In the marketing world, orange is associated with "cheap"; also, it is a difficult colour to combine according to the colour theory. I am certainly not a professional here, but if we make a complete change, which I think is a right step, then can we let a professional pick a new colour scheme for us?
- IIRC there was some talk about "portability" in this thread i.e. that the new logo should reflect it. Please, no. Portability meme has been a

marketing disaster for us. It should be killed, preferably in a drastic way, such that the whole new web site would not have a single use of this word any more. It does not mean that we are going to change the way we write the code, but as far as marketing is concerning - we need to change the meme and think about NetBSD's positioning.

These are small details, but a little contrasts perfectly enriches the overall page.

However, the top part of the page lacks that. Perhaps a single icon in red (just an idea) or some other little detail in different colour would improve the top part of the page as well?
